Note: Free Skate, if entered, should be considered the "first event".

RULES and ELIGIBILITY: This sanctioned, non-qualifying competition is open to all eligible skaters who are members of U.S. Figure Skating and will be conducted in accordance with the applicable rules of U.S. Figure Skating as set forth in the 2009 Official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook and Governing Council Minutes unless otherwise stated in this Announcement. Requirements for the 2009-2010 qualifying competition season shall apply. Also see Rules 3055-3057 and 3230-3235 in the Rulebook.

ISU JUDGING SYSTEM and RELATED INFORMATION

The ISU Judging System will be used to determine the event results for Intermediate through Senior Short Program and Juvenile through Senior Free Skate, in both singles, pairs and dance events. A critique for IJS events will be offered, if requested when checking in at the registration desk for the competition. All IJS event competitors need to submit the **PROGRAM CONTENT FORM** by May 15, 2009, **late forms will not be accepted**. The Program Content Form can be completed online at U.S. Figure Skating members only website: www.usfsaonline.org. You should also expect additional time needed by the accounting room to process and post events results. The ISU Judging System will be used to determine all results for these levels at Regional, Sectional, Junior National, and National events for the 2009-2010 season.

INFORMATION: We are only offering online entry and payment this year. Tentative schedules and a practice ice schedule will be sent via e-mail as soon as they become available. If you have further questions regarding entries or events, e-mail competition@wichitafsc.org or telephone (316) 361-0540 before 9:00 p.m. CDT. If you get an answering machine, record your question and you will receive a return call. **PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE RINK.**

ENTRIES: We are only accepting online entries this year. Entries must be received online by April 29th, 2009. Late entries and changes to entries will be accepted only with the permission of the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) and then must be accompanied by a \$25 fee. There will be no refunds after April 29th, 2009, unless 1) no competition exists in the event(s) entered, or 2) there is a death in the immediate family. The LOC reserves the right to limit entries due to time constraints.

REGISTRATION: Beginning Friday, June 12th, a registration desk will be maintained on the upper level of the rink opening one hour before the first practice session. Further registration hours will be announced after the final schedule is posted.

NOTICES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS: A bulletin board will be located in the registration area. It is the responsibility of the skater, parent and coach to check this board upon arrival and periodically during the competition for changes of schedule or other important information.

HOSPITALITY: Spectators are welcome and there is no admission charge. Volunteers will be on hand at the registration desk to give you brochures, directions and answer any questions about places of interest, many of which are very close to the rink.

WICHITA ICE CENTER FACILITY: There are two ice surfaces. The "Olympic" rink is 100'x200' with 1000 fixed stadium seats and the "NHL" rink is 85'x200' with bleacher seating. The rinks can be quite cold, so it is advisable to bring warm sweaters and coats. There is a snack bar on the lower level and a restaurant overlooking the rinks on the upper level. A pro shop is located just off the lobby and a full service shop is available for skate sharpening and repair. Ample parking may be found adjacent to the rink and across the street by the baseball park.

DIRECTIONS: The rink is located on the west bank of the Arkansas River, across from the central business district. Coming from the west on Kellogg (Hwy. 54), take the Seneca exit and follow the signs that direct you to Sycamore: then turn left (north), under the highway, to the rink. Coming from the east, take the Central Business exit, go straight ahead on the access road for four blocks, turn right (north) on Main, go one block, and then turn left (west) on Lewis, and drive straight ahead across the bridge.

MUSIC: Competitors in Free Skating, Short Program and Artistic events must furnish their own music on standard or mini sized CD. Cassettes will **NOT** be accepted. ALL MUSIC MUST BE TURNED IN AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION AND WILL NOT BE RETURNED UNTIL AFTER THE EVENT IS COMPLETED. **Each CD must have only ONE (1) track on it.** Any disc with more than one (1) track will **NOT** be accepted! Each CD should be clearly marked with the skater's name(s), event and exact running time. Lead in time (time before the music begins) on the CD may not exceed two (2) seconds. Each CD must be in a standard or slim hard sided "jewel case" or CD sleeve, also labeled with the skater's name and event. Jewel cases and CDs that are not properly identified will NOT be accepted. Bring at least two copies: one to turn in immediately upon registration and one for practice. A second CD should be readily available at the time of the event in case there is a problem with the original. The best possible care will be taken, however the Wichita FSC cannot assume liability for damage and will not be responsible for mailing any music that is not picked up before the end of the competition. Music will be provided for Dance events.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO: LOCAL MOTION PRODUCTIONS will again be official photographers and videographers. Orders may be placed in the photography area on the second level. Home video cameras may be used in the arenas, but only with their own power source. Personal cameras will be permitted, but please, **NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY** at any time during practice or competition.

AWARDS: Medals especially designed for this competition will be awarded to the first three places and ribbons for the next three places. If final rounds are held, trophies will be presented to the first three places. Awards will be presented in the photography area immediately following each event. It is required that costumes and skates be worn for the presentation and photos.

TEAM TROPHY: The visiting Clubs will compete for a high point trophy based on the placements of their participating skaters: 1st place = 4 points; 2nd place = 3 points; 3rd place = 2 points; 4th place = 1 point. Final rounds will not count towards the team trophy final total.

BOB GARVEY ARTISTIC AWARD: This year is will be the inaugural year for the presentation of this award honoring the best artistic program. This award is in memory of Bob Garvey who was the vice president of the club and suddenly passed just weeks after the 2008 Wichita Mid-Continent Invitational.

PRACTICE ICE: Official practice ice has tentatively been scheduled to begin Friday, June 12th. Most of the sessions will occur on Friday with only limited ice available once competition begins. When all requests for official practice ice have been assigned, and if the competition schedule allows, additional practice ice may be made available at registration, which will be sold on a first come, first served basis. Practice ice purchased during the competition (with the exception of final round practice ice) will be \$15 for Singles and Solo Dance events and \$18 per skater for Partner events. Each session is 30 minutes in length. **The deadline is April 29th, 2009.** See website for more details. **PRACTICE ICE IS NON-REFUNDABLE.**

SCHEDULE: A tentative schedule will be posted on the website as soon as it is available. We anticipate posting a confirmed schedule on or before May 23rd and individual confirmations will be e-mailed / mailed as soon as possible thereafter. The LOC does not assume responsibility for changes in travel plans that may result from schedule changes.

WITHDRAWALS: Any skater who does not appear for his/her first scheduled event will be withdrawn from all subsequent events unless that skater makes arrangements to withdraw with either the Chair of the Wichita Mid-Continent competition or with the Registration Desk.

REFUNDS: There will be no refunds after April 29th, 2009, unless 1) no competition exists in the event(s) entered, or 2) there is a death in the immediate family.

LIABILITY: Competitors, Parents, Coaches and Officials should read Part Two, rule #3222 of the 2009 Official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook carefully. U.S. Figure Skating, the Wichita Figure Skating Club, Officials of the Wichita Figure Skating Club, Competition Officials and Wichita Ice Center at 505 West Maple in Wichita, KS shall be held harmless from any loss, damage and/or injury that may be sustained by anyone in any manner while participating in any activities of this competition. Your signature on the entry form indicates your acceptance of this stipulation.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Competitors will enter events according to their test levels on April 29th, 2009. Skating "up" one level is permitted, however skaters may not skate below their test level nor may they compete on more than one level in each event with the exception of Solo Dance. There will be final rounds for Juvenile Free Skate, ALL Intermediate, Novice, Junior, and Senior events having 19 or more entries. The first event entry fee for Intermediate through Senior is a combined event; all skaters will compete in Short Program and Long Program. Results from the Short and Long programs will be combined to determine final rounds. Pre-Juvenile and lower groups will be divided by age. Age restrictions are as of April 29th, 2009. Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile skaters are 12 years and younger, Open Pre-Juvenile and Open Juvenile 13 to 18 years, Young Adults 19 to 20 years and Adults 21 years and older. **Two entries constitute an event.** If there is only one entry in an event, that competitor will be informed by telephone and they may then choose to withdraw with a full refund or skate up one level, if there is an event on the next highest level. Open events may be combined with standard events at the same level (i.e., Open Juvenile and Juvenile) to make an event. Male and female skaters may be combined to make an event. **Plan to arrive at the rink at least 45 minutes before the time your event starts.** Check in with a monitor as soon as you arrive. Competitors checking in after the official starting time of an event will not be allowed to skate in that event and the entry fee will not be refunded.

COMPULSORY MOVES

1. Requirements for division by test and age are the same as for Free Skating.
2. Moves may be done in any order with connecting steps in between. Half revolution jumps are not considered appropriate connecting steps and may be penalized. MIF moves may be done at the beginning, end or in the middle but must be distinct from other connecting steps.
3. There must be no turn or change of edge between the combination jumps.
4. An axel qualifies as a single jump.
5. Spins should be held for the minimum number of revolutions indicated in parenthesis after each spin.
6. The repetition of a failed element will not be judged. An extra element will be cause for a penalty.
7. *Male and female skaters may be combined to make an event.*

1/2 ICE for BEGINNER THRU PRE-JUVENILE / OPEN PRE-JUVENILE, & ADULT PRE-BRONZE THROUGH SILVER. MAX. TIME: 1:15 MINUTE.

JUMPS

1. Test requirements the same as for Free Skating.
2. Jumps must be skated in the order in which they are listed and must be exactly as stated, however the order of jumps within the combination jump is optional (example: double-single or single-double).
3. This is not a "mini-program". Only the stroking and edges necessary to prepare for the jumps are allowed. Extra moves and excessive connecting steps will be penalized.
4. An axel is a single jump.
5. Teams may consist of two or three skaters; however, a skater may perform more than one element in each category only if there is no third skater in the Team.

This event will be conducted as follows: At the conclusion of the warm up, the first skater will perform the first jump twice, then the second jump twice, then the combination jump twice. The judges will score only the best performance of each jump. This will be repeated for the rest of the skaters in order.

SPINS

1. Test requirements the same as Free Skating
2. Spins may be skated in any order and must be exactly as described. The required minimum revolutions in position are in parentheses.
3. Extra moves, repeated moves and excessive connecting steps will be penalized.
4. No jumps of any kind are permitted.
5. **Male and female skaters may be combined to make an event.**

ALL EVENTS WILL BE SKATED ON ½ ICE - NO MUSIC – MAX. TIME: 1:30 minutes for all levels.

Adult Silver	Camel spin (3) / Layback, attitude or sit spin (4) / Combination spin with one change of position, change of foot optional (3 each position).
Adult Gold	Flying spin of skaters choice (4) / Forward sit spin (4) / Combination spin with one change of foot and at least one change of position (4 each foot).

ARTISTIC – Qualifying Event for National Showcase

These events are like a show. This means the programs should be imaginative and creative. Above all, the choreography must reflect and interpret the music. Skaters placing fourth and higher in preliminary and higher artistic/showcase/interpretive solo events, including adult events, will be qualified to enter the next National Showcase. National Showcase contestants must also be qualified by test level. Duets and production ensembles are not required to qualify for National Showcase. GENERAL RULES:

1. Music is provided by the skater. Vocal music **IS PERMITTED**.
2. Costumes and make-up should not be overly garish or suggestive.
3. Hand props (cane, doll, baton, etc.) **ARE PERMITTED**. No live props (pets, animals). **PROPS MAY NOT BE PLACED IN THE CENTER OF THE ICE AT ANY TIME**. They may be placed on or along the barrier or handed to another person.
4. One mark will be given by the judges, basically for creativity, music interpretation and entertainment value. Credit for difficult jumps and spins will be based solely on their choreographic effectiveness, not on difficulty.
5. **Male and female skaters will compete in the same events.**
6. No whistles will sound, but please keep the time within 10 seconds of the time allotted.
7. All competitors are invited to appear in the official award photo (in full costume, of course!).

All levels will be divided into small groups strictly by age (except Adults):

*Levels may be combined, but only if necessary to make a competitive group (no more than 6 or 7).

MUSIC INTERPRETATION:

Music Interpretation consists of a single program composed/choreographed entirely by the skater, demonstrating ability to interpret music by combining moves, turns, footwork, jumps and spins. During the warm-up, skaters are not to converse with coaches, parents or fellow skaters. The skaters will hear the music twice during the warm-up. Following the warm-up all skaters except the first skater will be escorted to a locker room or another area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time and then will perform a program to the music. As each skater performs, the next skater in line will be allowed to hear the music for a third time before they perform to the music. The listening skater will not be allowed to view the performing skater.

There is to be no instruction allowed during this event from coaches, parents or fellow skaters. Skaters are judged on originality, pattern, technical (the ability to include jumps and spins) and music interpretation/expression. Jumps should be from the skating level or below.

All levels will be divided into small groups strictly by age (except Adults):
